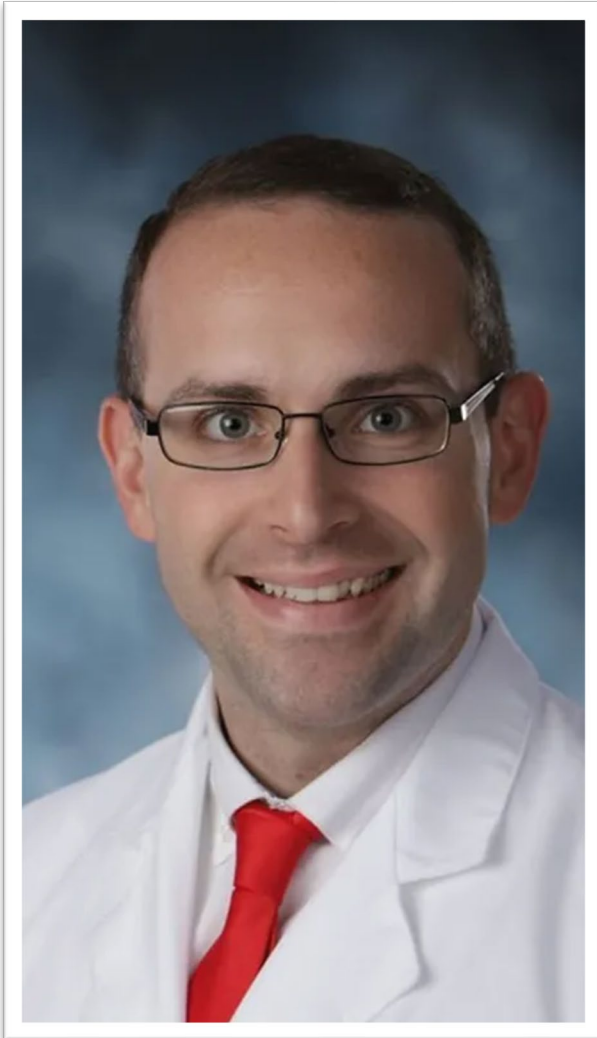


Timothy Miller, DPM, FACFAS, DABPM

Sunshine Ankle & Foot Experts, Orlando, FL



Dr. Miller's father was a police officer, and his mother was a registered nurse working in the ER. After hearing stories from his mother's daily encounters, he knew he wanted to dedicate his life to medicine. He attended Johns Hopkins University for his undergraduate studies and played football for the varsity team. While there, he suffered an injury to his ankle. Seeking help from an expert, he was cared for by a podiatrist. After seeing the positive impact the field of podiatry had on patients, he chose to study podiatry.

Dr. Miller attended the New York College of Podiatric Medicine, where he graduated in the top 10% of his class and was inducted into the Pi Delta National Honor Society. He completed residency at Atlantic Health Morristown Medical Center in Morristown, NJ, the official healthcare partner of the New York Jets, serving as chief resident in his final year. During his training, he performed more than 1,200 surgical procedures dedicated to foot and ankle ailments, including complex reconstruction of the lower extremity. After residency, he completed a fellowship at the Foot and Ankle Specialists of Ohio focused on gaining advanced surgical training including limb reconstruction, trauma treatment and deformity correction, along with Charcot and diabetic limb salvage.

Dr. Miller is board certified by the American Board of Podiatric Medicine and board certified in foot surgery and reconstructive rearfoot and ankle surgery by the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgeons. He holds certifications in arthroscopic surgery of the foot and ankle and total ankle joint replacement.

Michael J. Axe, MD

First State Orthopaedics, Delaware



Dr. Michael Axe is a board certified sports orthopedist who trained at the Hughston Clinic and did a trauma fellowship at Harbor View Hospital in Seattle before joining First State Orthopaedics in Delaware in 1985. He was honored by the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine with both the Mr. Sports Medicine and Brady Community Service awards. Since 1990, Dr. Axe has been a clinical professor of Physical Therapy at the No. 1 ranked University of Delaware and has taught more than 1,000 students. He is one of only 16 physicians inducted as an honorary member of the American Physical Therapy Association and is the APTA's only honorary physician member of the AOSSM.

He is a founding member of First State Orthopaedics and a founding member and past president of the Delaware Inter Scholastic Association-Sports Medicine Advisory Committee. As a research scientist, he has more than 85 peer-reviewed articles. Dr. Axe's professional life has been focused on community service, research and teaching to all medical disciplines including pharma.

Stephen Badylak, DVM, PhD, MD

McGowan Institute of Regenerative Medicine at University of Pittsburgh



Dr. Badylak is deputy director of the McGowan Institute of Regenerative Medicine and a professor in the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine's Departments of Surgery and Bioengineering. He attended medical school at Indiana University and earned his DVM and PhD degrees from Purdue University. He holds more than 75 U.S. patents and 400 patents worldwide, has authored more than 425 scientific publications and 60 book chapters, and recently edited two textbooks: "Host Response to Biomaterials" and "Immunomodulatory Biomaterials." He serves on the Immunology Advisory Board to the Medical Device Section of the FDA. More than 15 million patients have been treated with bioscaffolds developed in Dr. Badylak's laboratory.

Missouri Foot and Ankle, St. Louis, MO

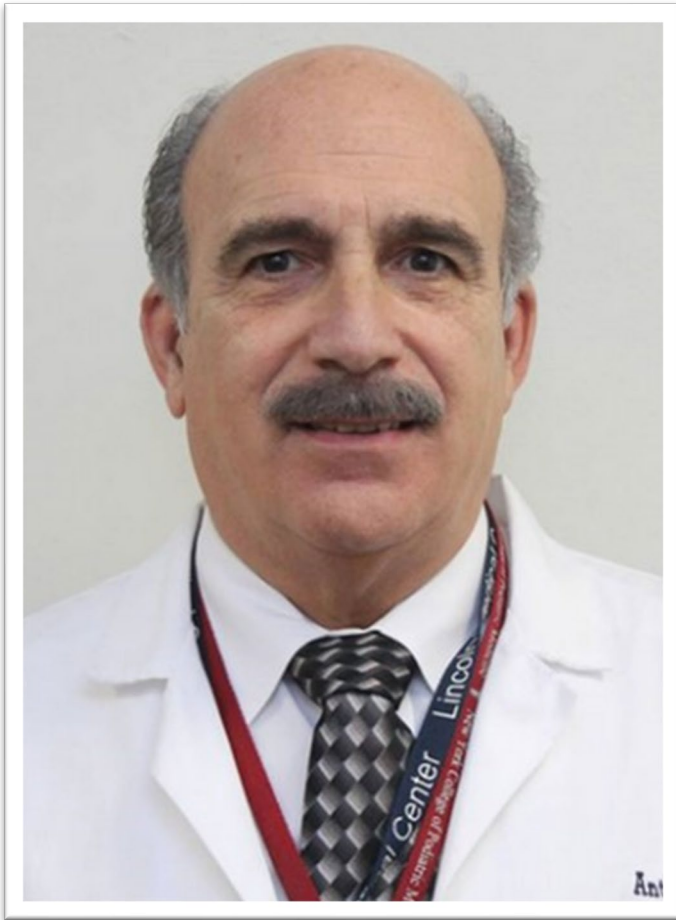

Charleston Wound Care, Charleston, SC

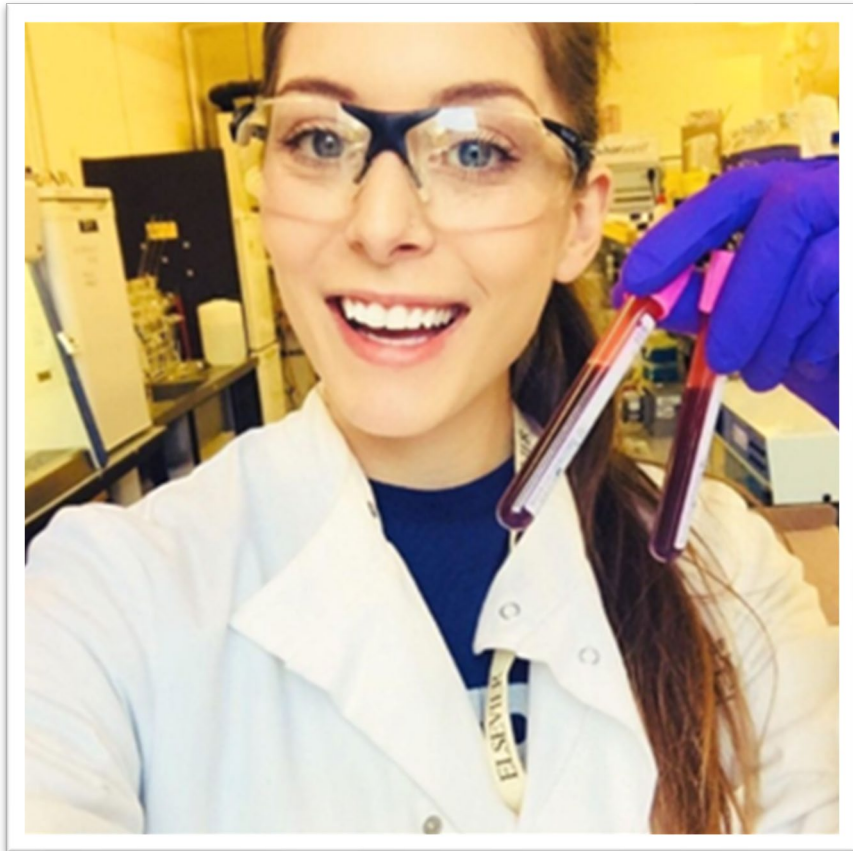

Scarlett Milo, PhD

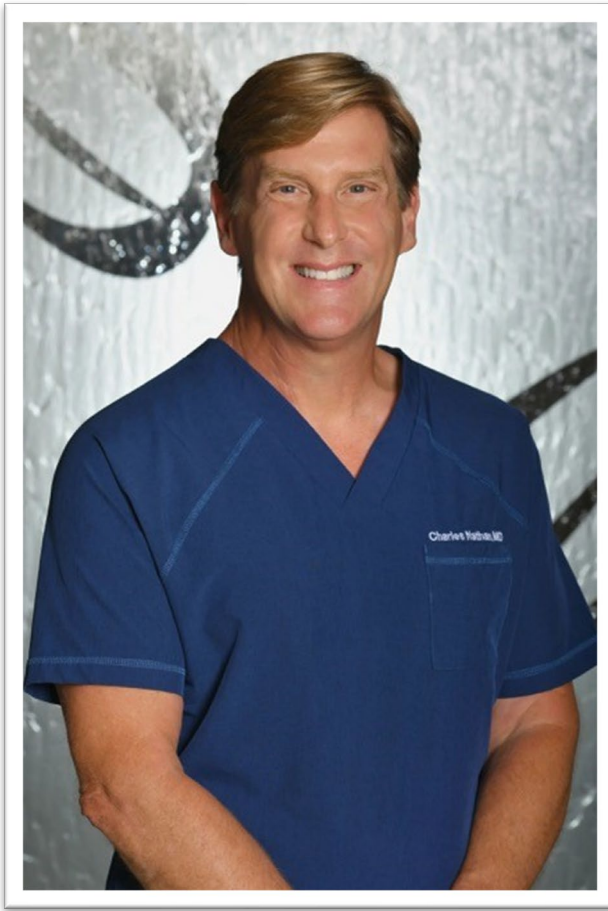
Convatec Advanced Wound Care, London, UK
